What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

The term “hazardous” refers to materials that are corrosive, flammable, reactive or toxic. Look for these symbols on the packaging:



CORROSIVE wastes are acids or bases that are capable of corroding metal containers, such as storage tanks, drums, and barrels.



FLAMMABLE or ignitable wastes can create fires under certain conditions, are spontaneously combustible, or have a flash point less than 60°C (140°F).



REACTIVE wastes can cause explosions, toxic fumes, gases or vapors when heated, compressed, or mixed with water.



POISON or toxic wastes are those containing concentrations of certain substances in excess of regulatory thresholds which are expected to cause injury or illness to human health or the environment.

Accepted at the HHW Depot

We can only accept HHW that is identifiable and safely contained in a leak-proof container.



Base Corrosives

Drain opener, paint stripper, furnace or stove cement, sodium hydroxide, ammonia-based cleaners and metal polishes.



Acid Corrosives

Battery acid, metal cleaners, muriatic acid and bonding agents (oxalic acid).



Solid Flammables

Adhesives, roofing tar/cement, grease, plastic wood, driveway sealer, foundation coating, plastic cement, autobody fillers, fiberglass resin/epoxy, pipe joint compound, mortar and caulking compound.



Flammable Gas

Aerosol containers (shaving foam, cooking spray).



Liquid Flammables

Gas, creosote, kerosene, diesel fuel, shellac, ABS solvent cement, floor wax, contact cement, transmission fluid, camp fuel/ignitor, acetone (nail polish), brake fluid, turpentine, butane, methyl hydrate, sealers, varsol, paint thinner, motor oil (and filters), gas line antifreeze, enamels, stains and paints.



Reactives

Chlorine bleach, fertilizers and photo developers.



Poison

Herbicides, insecticides, pesticides, antifreeze and wood preservative.



Other

Refillable and non-refillable propane cylinders (propane tanks), fluorescent light ballasts and rechargeable batteries.



Safe Sharps Disposal

Syringes, needles and lancets should only be placed in a Safe Sharps Container.

Pick-up a free container at any pharmacy or Canadian Diabetes Association (CDA) Supply Centre, and when it is full, return it. Sharps are accepted free of charge at pharmacies, for disposal. The Community Recycling Centre cannot accept sharps.

! Never place sharps in a blue bag or garbage bag, even if they are contained.

NOT Accepted at the HHW Depot

- ✗ All sharps including syringes and lancets.
- ✗ Business, industrial and institutional hazardous wastes.
- ✗ Bio-medical or pharmaceutical waste.
- ✗ PCBs, radioactives or explosives (ammunition, fireworks)
- ✗ Unidentified HHW
- ✗ HHW from outside the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg, and the Towns of Bridgewater and Mahone Bay.

Empty Paint Cans

Ensure no liquid paint remains in cans. If there is wet paint, it must be dropped off for recycling at the HHW Depot or a local ENVIRO™ Depot.



Empty metal paint cans: remove lid and put out for metal collection during fall or spring clean-up.

Empty plastic paint cans: place in garbage bag. Cans are too contaminated to recycle.
